






About Us

Disaster Response



- Disaster response refers to actions taken during and immediately after a disaster to ensure that its effects are minimized, and that the people affected are given relief and support. (FEMA)
- Related to prevention & preparedness
- We know to dial 911 for police/fire engine/ambulance
- What if first responders are not available?

Neighborhood Disaster Response



- Remember: ...ensure that the effects of a disaster are minimized, and that the people affected are given relief and support.
- How?
- In a disaster, use the Neighborhood
 Disaster Response checklist
 (www.getreadyatherton.org/respond)



Step 1: Report to Your EAP



- The Emergency Assembly Point (EAP) is the neighborhood hub of response activity. Start here to give & get help.
- Instruction card on back of sign







Step 2: Assemble at Your EAP



- First to arrive is the Incident Commander (IC)
- IC may be CERT trained



Step 3: Assign a Scribe

• Ongoing role - document the situation, injuries, etc.



Step 4: Set Up Your EAP




All hands on deck!

As available, set up teambased areas with:

- Tables, chairs, canopies
- Scribing tools
- Lighting





Step 6: Set Up Communications

- Communicate with "runners" in the field
- Communicate with the Town

Step 7: Set Up Logistics

- Volunteer check-in/management
- Crowd/traffic control
- Security







Step 8: Perform Reconnaissance

A. D. A. P. T.
Atherton Disaster and
Preparedness Team

 Part of Operations setup - check on homes, note where help is needed. 3-person teams.
 Safety first.



Step 9: Prepare Medical & Shelter Areas

- Create spaces for medical support
- Set up areas for other immediate needs (food, water, sanitation, etc.)



Step 10: Deploy Rapid Response Teams



 Visit homes or areas where help is needed, at the direction of the Operations leader



After Step 10, your neighborhood will be organized so that residents can give and get help until first responders become available.

Reminders – During a Disaster:



- Hydrate, eat, rest
- Watch for low blood sugar, exhaustion, stress
- Check in regularly with your family

Next Steps



- Know where your nearest EAPs are
- Print both Disaster Response checklists, put copies with your emergency kits
- Make sure your <u>household</u> is ready (make a plan, get supplies, register for SMC Alert)
